SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY:

Ravenna is a small town, in the heart of Northeast Ohio's industrial and technological corridor. It is located 18 miles north east of Akron, 35 miles southeast of Cleveland, and 35 miles west of Youngstown. Ravenna is the seat of Portage County. While a number of Ravenna residents commute to jobs in Akron and Cleveland, many are also employed by local manufacturers that produce items ranging from rubber to plastic products to foundries and building supplies. Ravenna is governed by a City Council and a Mayor, and is home to the "Main Street Mile", a curated one (1) mile loop that encompasses the heart of downtown Ravenna and Main Street Ravenna, a project designed to rejuvenate the downtown district!
